
JOB CREATION THROUGH INFORMATION AND COMMUNICATION TECHNOLOGIES (ICT) IN MOZAMBIQUE



The Programme

- Title: "JOB CREATION THROUGH INFORMATION AND COMMUNICATION TECHNOLOGIES (ICT) IN MOZAMBIQUE"
- Total Budget: Euro 3.500.000 (2.290.000 for this grant)
- Target Area: Maputo City and Province (80%), Manica and Tete.
- **Programme Duration:** 36 months (min. 30 months for this grant)
- Central authorities partnering AICS: Secretaria de Estado da Juventude e Emprego (SEJE) and subordinate entities (IFPELAC, INEP, INJ)







Objectives of the programme

Global Objective:

To contribute to sustainable, inclusive, and decent work-creating economic development in Mozambique, especially for the growing youth population

Specific Objective:

To increase youth employment in Mozambique, in particular in the capital and the provinces of Maputo, Manica and Tete

Strategy:

Support and integrate various interventions foreseen in the Employment Policy Action Plan (PAPE) 2021-2024, such as investment in human capital and the creation of decent employment, mainly through ICTs



Context: Programme components

- 1. Vocational Training: Support for investments in vocational training targeted to labour market needs, with a focus on the ICT sector.
- 2. Job Creation & Entrepreneurship: mainly by promoting the expansion of competitive micro/small enterprises and facilitating access to financing and mentoring services (existing and provided by a new business incubator specialised in the ICT sector).
- Quality and safety: Institutional support for the implementation of health, safety at work and social security standards.
- 4. Institutional strengthening of the State Secretariat for Youth and Employment (SEJE) and its subordinate entities IFPELAC, INEP and INJ.



Context: Programme components

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- 3. Quality and safety: Institutional support for the implementation of health safety at work and social

This Action is a subset of the Programme, focused on the first two programme components

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Priorities/Expected results of the Action

ER1 - <u>Integrated and strengthened offer of vocational training</u> <u>courses delivered by IFPELAC</u> with a better response to the <u>market needs</u> and absorption capacity, with an emphasis on <u>ICT</u>, ensuring fair access to <u>youth groups in vulnerable situations</u> (in particular women, persons with disabilities and possibly young people in detention or street dwellers).

ER2 - Employment created and conditions improved for approximately 3,000 new jobs (salaried and self-employed) through support for creation and expansion of micro and small enterprises with a high potential for competitiveness, matching demand and supply of labour/jobs (job-fairs, internships...)**

** (focus on youth groups in vulnerable situations)



Main outputs - ER1 (Expected Deliverables)

- dialogue between IFPELAC training institutions and the private sector facilitated and supported to identify the most in-demand skill profiles(target: at least 20 meetings per year);
- existing ICT-related curricula revised and/or new ones developed, based on the skills required by labour market, with specific attention to students with specific needs (adaptation of content and training methods...) (target: 5);
- existing ICT and non-ICT tools introduced or improved to adapt courses to ensure full accessibility of people with disabilities (the target will be set at the beginning of the activities jointly by the grantee and IFPELAC);
- **ICT-education support centre established** by refurbishment of existing facilities (to be identified by IFPELAC), with computer and educational equipment, and adaptations for full access and use by persons with disabilities (*target: 1 most likely at the IFPELAC headquarters compound in Maputo City*);
- the IFPELAC vocational training centres already organised and providing ICT courses shall be strengthened by ICT equipment for teaching (including distance learning) (target: at least the existing 2);
- courses in ICT literacy and professional use of specific applications organised and supported (target: at least 24 courses per year);
- **scholarships** (compliant with IFPELAC standard and regulations) allocated and managed to ensure equal access to training courses and reward merit (*target: 24 per year in each of the target areas*);
- "training of trainers" courses held to achieve the outputs mentioned above (target: at least 4 courses per year, for 3 years, in the 4 geographical target areas).



Main outputs - ER2 (Expected Deliverables)

- baseline survey conducted and study on the perspectives for ICT in traditional sectors (digitalisation of business processes) and for the digital economy;
- **job fairs (in person and/or virtual) organised** and run according to INEP's standards, which shall also involve scholarships, pre-professional and professional internships (*target: at least 4 fairs per year and 5,000 participants*);
- Various forms of dialogue (meetings, platforms, open days, etc.) promoted and realised between the business world and Employment Centres for the provision of professional and preprofessional internships, with links with start-ups, cooperatives, other initiatives supported by the program and its partners (target at least 8 meetings or structured, facilitated interactions per year, per target province);
- SEJE and its operational entities provided with **technical assistance** for the promotion and management of dialogue and coordination of the involved stakeholders (*target: the three target provinces are supported*);
- remunerated internships funded and management expenses covered for unpaid internships (target: at least 150 internships per year, for 3 years);
- INJ and INEP's staff trained and supported with technical assistance to assist beneficiaries of FAIJ (Fundo de Apoio às Iniciativas Juvenis), of "Meu Kit, Meu Emprego" programme, as well as of the services of the "digital hub";
- At least one "IT hub" established (refurbishment of building, equipped rooms, connectivity, accessibility and communications) and run (target: for at least 2 years), according to INEP standards and providing incubation and acceleration services to micro and small businesses; Independent evaluation of the whole programme results (all 4 components)

- √30 36 months





- Financial allocation (par. 1.3)
- **√2.290.000** Euro
- ✓ Grant requested must be 100% of total eligible costs of the action (i.e., no co-financing)
- ✓ The proposals shall allocate 80% of the funding budget to the geographical area of Maputo (City and Province) and at least 25% of the funding budget to benefit people with disabilities (PwD).



Eligibility of applicants (par. 2.1.1)

1. Lead applicant

- be a legal person and
- be non-profit-making and
- be established in Mozambique or in one of the Member States of the European Union and
- be authorized to operate in Mozambique and
- not be linked to any of the above-mentioned central authorities partnering AICS in the programme AID 12454

2. Co-applicant

- be a legal person and
- be established in any of the countries belonging to the Organisation for the Economic Cooperation and Development (OECD) as member countries or eligible for development aid according to the OECD-DAC List of ODA Recipients **and**
- not be linked to any of the above-mentioned central authorities partnering AICS in the programme AID 12454.

Note:

- **3. Associates** may be linked to any of the above-mentioned central authorities partnering AICS in the programme AID 12454 (par. 2.1.3)
- 4. Affiliated entities may be established in OECD countries (...) (par. 2.1.2)



Eligibility of applicants

Additional information

- The **lead applicant** may **not submit more than 1 application** under this call for proposals.
- The lead applicant may not be a co-applicant or an affiliated entity in another application at the same time.
- A co-applicant/affiliated entity may not be the co-applicant or affiliated entity in more than 1 application under this call for proposals.
